Begin in Wittenberg, where Luther famously nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the church door, igniting a profound religious transformation. Explore the Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, where he took refuge from the wrath of the pontiff, then move on to Worms, where he refused to recant his beliefs. Cross into Switzerland to visit Zurich and Geneva, and delve into the historic sites of persecution and resistance which also celebrate the perseverance of the Christian spirit. Experience the picturesque landscapes which served as a backdrop to Luther's struggles and triumphs.You'll explore the wonders of Old World Europe, delighting in its natural beauty, unique architecture, breathtaking sights, and splendid cuisine. A lifetime of memories await you!

12-DAY ITINERARY

DAY 1 DEPARTURE

We depart the U.S.A. for our flight to Berlin.

DAY 2

ARRIVE BERLIN

On arrival in Berlin, we will meet our coach driver and tour guide. A local guide will join us for a guided tour of Berlin including stops at the famous Brandenburg Gate for photos. We will also see the Cathedral, the Reichstag building and the lively boulevards, and Cold War Check Point Charlie Museum. Dinner is at our hotel in Berlin this evening.

DAY 3

BERLIN TO WITTENBERG

After a relaxed breakfast, we will visit Sans-Souci Palace and Gardens in Potsdam, the summer residence of Frederick the Great and his retreat from the challenges of war and diplomacy. Sanssouci was built between 1745 and 1747, in an Italian rococo style. The gardens were created by Peter Joseph Lenné, Prussia's greatest landscape gardener. We will arrive in Wittenberg mid-afternoon and join the Wittenberg English Ministry service, where we will worship with believers from all over the world. We will dine at our hotel this evening.

DAY 4

TOUR WITTEMBERG

Our guided tour of Wittenberg will take us to the main sites connected with Martin Luther, including the Schlosskirche (Castle Church) where he nailed his famous 95 Theses to the door in 1517. Although the original door was destroyed in a fire, the replica has all 95 Theses in bronze, which is magnificent. We will visit St. Mary's Church and tour the Lutherhalle (Luther House) Museum, where Luther lived for 35 years. It was here that he had his pivotal "Tower Experience" while reading Romans 1:17.The afternoon is at leisure and we will meet up again for our evening meal at our hotel.

DAY 5

ERFURT

After breakfast we will drive to Erfurt, where Luther spent time as a monk. Our guide will take us on a walking tour including St. Mary's Cathedral where Luther was ordained. We'll also tour the Augustinian Monastery and its Luther exhibition, including a typical cell from Luther's time. We will end the tour with a special service in the chapel. We will dine at our hotel this evening. Our guide will lead an optional evening walk to see the floodlit cathedral and lively cafes.

DAY 6 erfurt -day trip to eisenach

Our day trip today is to nearby Eisenach, beginning with a tour of Wartburg Castle. In 1521, while fleeing from the wrath of the Pope, Luther took refuge in the castle after a fake kidnapping staged by his friend and protector, Frederick the Wise. We will tour the Wartburg and see where Luther finished translating the New Testament into German in just 11 weeks. Luther spent time in the nearby town of Eisenach at as school boy and sang in the choir of St. George's Church, where the Bach family also worshiped. The afternoon is free to explore the town or tour the Bach Museum and Luther House Museum. We will return to Erfurt at the end of the day.

DAY 7

WORMS - HEIDELBERG

Drive to Worms for a walking tour to see the Reformation Monument; it was here, during the Imperial Diet in 1521 that Martin Luther challenged the entire Roman Catholic establishment by his refusal to recant the great doctrines of Protestantism. Continue to Heidelberg for dinner and overnight.

DAY 8 HEIDELBERG CASTLE & TOUR

Enjoy Heidelberg, a gorgeous town on the Neckar River. The castle, once a royal residence, was the capital of the Rhineland Palatinate. It was destroyed in 1671 and is now a fascinating ruin. During the Reformation, the local rulers embraced Protestantism, then turned to Calvinism and the Heidelberg Catechism was finalized here in 1563. We will dine in our hotel this evening.

DAY 9

BLACKFOREST OPEN AIR MUSEUM

After a leisurely breakfast, we will drive through the scenic Black Forest region. We will visit the Black Forest Open Air Museum where we can see impressive, fully furnished Black Forest farm houses built from the 16th to the 19th century. We will have time to walk around the museum and purchase regional delicacies in the on-site restaurant. In the afternoon we cross over in Switzerland and check into our hotel in Zurich. We will dine in our hotel this evening.

DAY 10

REFORMATION TOUR OF ZURICH - LUZERN SIGHTSEEING

We will take a tour of Zurich today, to learn about Zwingli and the Anabaptists on a tour of the key Reformation. We will tour the Grossmünster, the Helferei (where Zwingli lived) and see the Zwingli Statue. Other notable sites are the Fraumünster (the famous Catholic Cathedral) with its Marc Chagall windows. After a stroll through the historic Auld Stadt (old city) we will have free time before we continue to Lucerne; Lucerne has a picturesque lakeside setting against an impressive mountain backdrop and is often referred to as "the essence of Switzerland; dinner.

DAY 11

REFORMATION TOUR OF GENEVA

Our short morning tour of city will include the 14th century Chapel Bridge, which is the most photographed monument in Switzerland. Mark Twain described the Lion Monument as "the most mournful and moving piece of stone in the world" We continue to Geneva. where Calvin, Knox, Farel and others brought Christ's teachings to eager listeners. Our tour will begin at the impressive Reformation Monument. Four statues of four Reformation leaders stand as sentinels to truth and courage inspired by godly faith. We will see Calvin's church, the Auditoire de Calvin, (Calvin's Academy, also known as The Protestant Lecture Hall), where the inspired theologian himself taught. Next door is St. Pierre's Cathedral, where John Calvin preached. We can see his chair and a restored section decorated as it would have been before Calvin. Our final stop is an audio guide tour through the incredible Reformation Museum. Below the museum and the Cathedral, we can see the ruins of a Roman sanctuary, a 4th-century basilica, and a 6th-century church. We have free time this afternoon to experience these key sites before we dine at a local restaurant this evening.

DAY 12

GENEVA - FLIGHT INTO TO THE U.S.A

We depart our hotel for our flight. We will return with memories and new friends to last a lifetime and beyond!



PRICING: Our pricing is in U.S. dollars, and is based upon the current rate of international exchange between the U.S. dollar and foreign currencies at the time prices are posted. NOT INCLUDED IN PRICING: Passport costs, tips, optional pre/post hotel nights due to traveler's arrival and departure preferences, hotel or other costs incurred to accommodate travel connections, items of a personal nature, including, but not limited to, laundry, non-included meals, room service at hotel(s), phone calls, Internet, etc.

TRAVEL PROTECTION INSURANCE: *Discovery* recommends purchasing a travel protection plan that helps offset costs and expenses should something unexpected occur. There are various plans available which cover Trip Cancellation, Trip Interruption, Emergency Medical and Emergency Evacuation, Emergency Repatriation, Trip Delay, Baggage Delay, and more. *Discovery* does not offer travel insurance, but many plans are available for purchase elsewhere, for example, at *MissionSafe.com*.

PASSPORT REQUIREMENTS: Passports are required for all travelers, including children. Passports must remain valid for 6 months beyond the completion of your travel dates; and are required for air travel outside the U.S. For U.S. citizens and residents, more information is available online at www.travel.state.gov/passport, or by calling the *National Passport Information Center* at 877-487- 2778. When necessary, a group visa for U.S. citizens will be obtained by *Discovery* for those confirmed by the final payment date. Non-U.S. citizens and U.S. citizens originating from outside the U.S. should consult their country's embassy regarding specific requirements for entry into each and every country of destination. Your passport name must match the name on your registration, cruise boarding pass, and airline ticket, or you may be denied travel. It is the personal responsibility of each passenger to fully comply with all immigration and documentation requirements.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS: Travel suppliers (cruise line, air carrier, shore excursion agents, etc.) may have restrictions regarding certain physical requirement accommodations. If you have a medical condition (mobility limitations, pregnancy, etc.), or use medical equipment which could affect your travel, consult your physician and notify *Discovery*, so we can provide you with information regarding possible restrictions. If you are unable to get on and off the bus and walk without the assistance of another individual, you must bring someone with you to provide assistance, or you may stay on the bus as needed.

PAYMENT INFORMATION: Final payments **MUST** be received ninety (90) days prior to departure. Payments received inside ninety (90) days will be assessed an \$80 late payment fee. **NOTE:** All reservations not fully paid by the ninety-day deadline are subject to cancellation, and **Discovery** will not be held responsible. Cancellation of airline seats or changes to passport registrations within one hundred (100) days of departure each carry a penalty of \$100 per person. Registration deposits must be made online by credit card, and subsequent payments may be made online by credit card or by mailed payment methods, including personal checks, cashier's checks, money orders, and credit card checks drawn against your card. Subsequent payments made online by credit card incur a 2.25% processing fee, but NO processing fee is charged for the deposit at time of registration.

REGISTRATION & DEPOSIT: A deposit of \$500 per person is required at the time of registration. The deposit may be charged to your *Visa, Mastercard, American Express*, or *Discover* card. <u>Registrations received within ninety (90) days of departure must be paid in</u> full. A late registration may result in an additional fee for airfare, depending on the airline and seating availability.
